Subj: LDP

I write on behalf of Cammo Residents Association,(CRA) who as you know submitted timeous representations on various aspects of the proposed LDP.

I understand that matters regarding the LDP are before committee on 3 October.

There is one point that I would seek to bring to your attention, and that is the suggestion that all LATE representations be accepted, as if they had been received on time.

We have to object to this blanket approach.

It may be that an individual had a difficulty with submission, but a commercial organisation has no such excuse. We note in particular that Braehead Partnership and Gladman Development Ltd have sent in a representation which is out of time. There is no real excuse for a commercial organisation, particularly if it be one who seeks to profit by promoting alterations to the plan, for failure to submit within the reasonably generous time scale provided by the consultation.

Accordingly, we object to any preferential treatment accorded to late submissions, and ask the Committee to note our position.

The submission by Braehead seems to seek to add more land to HSG20.

Clearly we have not had the opportunity to comment. But it should be obvious that as we are against HSG20, then we will be against whatever it is that Braehead are seeking.

There may, however, be new issues raised by their representation, or amendments necessary to ours to respond to the new situation.

Thus it would be unfair, and a breach of natural justice, for the committee to consider these representations.

Accordingly, we object to that.

Kindly acknowledge receipt, and confirm that this will be drawn to the attention of the Committee before the matter is considered.
